Table Saw Jigs

At the March 12th Guild meeting Guild Member, Gene Terlisner, will be presenting Table Saw Jigs that he uses on his Saw-Stop table saw to help him to preform different sawing tasks.

Gene will be using the Saw-Stop table saw in the East Kentwood High School wood shop to demonstrate the different jigs he has created to do miter and other joints on everything from small project pieces to wood slabs.

Gene feels the jigs he has developed speeds his construction time on projects, while at the same time, makes it safer for him to complete risky cuts that his projects require.

Gene's presentation will be about 45 minutes long, after which he will answer questions on the construction and use of his table saw jigs.


