
#### **President's Corner**

Perhaps an auction


Guild swap meet — a great way to clear out unused tools and pick up a few bargains!

#### **Cool Tools with Dale Smith**

Dale Smith highlighted a number of tools over the past couple of months that have missed the newsletter. I wanted to make sure they got mentioned because they are really useful.



MicroJig makes a number of tools for use on the table saw that can really aid in safety and accuracy. The Gripper (upper left photo) is versitile enough to push almost any shape piece of wood through a saw while keeping hands safe.

The ZeroPlay sled and clamps (right two photos) offer an easy to use setup for cutting accurate parts, time after time.





Once you use an oscillating multi-tool, you will wonder how you ever got along without one. These tools are so versitile that they can be used for heavy duty remodeling work all the way down to small wood model building. They can do jobs no other tool will do.
