



December presentation recap

Marquetry is a centuries old craft of using a variety of thin wood veneers to make intricate patterns on furniture, curios, floors, and almost anything made of wood. Phil Miclea gave an interesting presentation about some of the different types of marquetry including Packet Marquerty and Louis Cubes. I can imagine it would take people many years to master this craft.










Louis cubes marquetry can be recognized by people from the 1980's as the "Q-bert" design.

December Cool Tools

You don't have to be around woodworkers for very long to start hearing about Japanese style hand saws. They cut smoothly, are extremely versitile, and can produce fine quality craftsmanship right up there with the most expensive power tools. They can also be much faster to use when you need a quick cut — rather than setting up your cut on a miter or table saw, just grab the hand saw and you are done.
